


Give thanks...

I meet with a group of Yr 10 lads on a Monday evening to study the bible together. But what a privilege for those who God has chosen to bring near, and chooses to presently dwell with by his Spirit, and with assurance to bring us home. It keeps us walking the line of faith.

It is right to know we're never beyond unbelief, we're too fickle in faith. But the gospel is bright against the backdrop of unbelief, and it transforms us day by day to greater understanding, deeper praise, and more steady faithfulness to Jesus.
